BLOCK SIZE:

I am uncertain as of yet how I am going to "set" these blocks. Cut the background 18" x 18" for now...if yours is 17³/₄" wide for some reason do not worry...they will be trimmed down smaller...we have lots of room to go down as far as 14¹/₂"...I am thinking I would like more space around the blocks but again will be making this decision at a later date. **Keep the extra fabric as we may use this too!**

FABRICS & WOOLS NEEDED:

FQ black print/black muslin
13" x 14" Brown Plaid wool - basket
4" x 13" Mill Dyed Cream Texture wool - circle flowers
4" x 8" Buttermilk Texture wool - star in flowers
2¹/₂" x 7" 4 different Green wools - leaves
2" x 10" Spring wool - stems

VALDANI THREADS:

#5-P12
#8-5 or #5-P9
#5-P9
#12-P2, 0575 & 199
#12-0519

DIRECTIONS:

Trim and tape your block layout sheets together at the dashed lines.

Trace the appropriate number of appliqué shapes onto fusible web using the reversed shape page.

For the stems, cut a 2" x 10" piece of fusible web and iron to the 2" x 10" Spring wool. Sub cut into ³/₁₆" strips (this is bigger than the ¹/₈" but less than ¹/₄"). Our 5" x 15" Creative Grid ruler has a ³/₁₆" line on it specifically for cutting wool stems.

Using a light box or some sort of light source, lay paper pattern on top, and remove paper off the back of the fusible web if using SAS2 light. Start with the basket, add the stems and leaves and then flowers.

Iron with lots of steam using an up and down motion, quick presses - do not leave the iron on the wool for long periods of time.

STITCHING:

Cross-stitch over the stems, using #12-0519.

Blanket stitch the following:

Basket - #5-P12
Flower Circles - #8-5 or #5-P9
Frey Check the cream flowers before stitching.
Flower Stars - #5-P9
Leaves - #12-0519, 199, 0560
Double thread #8-0575

LEAF STITCHES -

Stitch larger alternating chain stitch down the middle of each leaf with #5-P2. This may not be in your thread kits. Double the #8 or purchase the 5 weight.

FLOWER STITCHES -




Draw a ⁵/₈" circle in the center of the wool star with the dark clover marking pen. Stem stitch around the circle using #12-PT11.



Fill the center with drizzle stitches in #PT11 and M28.

Press block upside down on wool pressing mat or thick towel using lots of steam.
