




## Cutting Instructions

Qty	9" finished block
4	2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " squares, cut in half diagonally (A)
1	3 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " square (B)
4	2 <sup>5</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " squares (B)
4	2" squares (B)
1	4 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " square (C)
4	3 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " x 2" rectangles (C)
2	3 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " squares, cut in half diagonally (D)

## Piecing Instructions

### Step 1


Lay out (2) A triangles and (1) 2" B square as shown. Join right triangle to B square—align as shown, with fabric lined up across top, and narrow point of the A triangle extending below the B square. Press seam to A triangle.

Repeat for other A triangle, and clip dog ear.

Layer D triangle with pieced unit, right sides together, and stitch along the long seam.

Press seam to D triangle.

Repeat to make (4) A-B-D 'Downhill' units. Trim units to 3½" and/or clip dog ears.



### Step 2

On the wrong side of each B 2⅝" square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.


With right sides together, align (2) B squares in opposite corners of the C square as shown.

Stitch a scant ¼" seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield (2) partial flying geese units, and press the seams to the B triangles or open.

With right sides together, align another B square in the corner of the C triangle as shown.


Stitch a scant ¼" seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield (2) complete flying geese units, and press the seams to the B triangles or open.

Repeat to make (4) B-C flying geese units. Trim to 3½" x 2".



### Step 3

Join B-C flying geese and C rectangles so the C fabric forms a 'house' shape. Press as desired and trim to 3½".




### Step 4

Lay out (4) A-B-D Downhill units, (4) flying geese-rectangle units, and (1) B square as shown.

Join units to make the full block.

Trim block to 9½".
