




### Cutting Instructions

Qty	9" finished block
4	3¼" squares (A)
16	1⅝" squares (A)
16	1⅝" squares (B)
1	3¼" square (C)
1	3¼" square (D)
1	3¼" square (E)
1	3¼" square (F)




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## Piecing Instructions


### Step 1

On the wrong side of the  $3\frac{1}{4}$ " A squares, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown. Place A and C squares right sides together. Stitch a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield two HSTs, and press the seams to the darker triangles.



Repeat to make (2) A-C HSTs, (2) A-D HSTs,  
(2) A-E HSTs, and (2) A-F HSTs.


Trim units to  $2\frac{3}{4}$ ".



### Step 2

Lay out (2)  $1\frac{5}{8}$ " A squares and (2) B squares as shown. Join into rows, pressing seams to the darker fabric. Join rows to form the unit and press seams open.

Repeat to make (8) A-B 4-Patch units. Trim to  $2\frac{3}{4}$ ".




### Step 3

Lay out A-C HSTs and (2) 4-Patch units as shown. Join to form the C Bowtie unit, pressing seams open.

Repeat to make D, E, and F Bowtie units.

Trim to 5".




### Step 4

Lay out Bowtie units as shown.

Join units to form the full block.

Trim to  $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".
